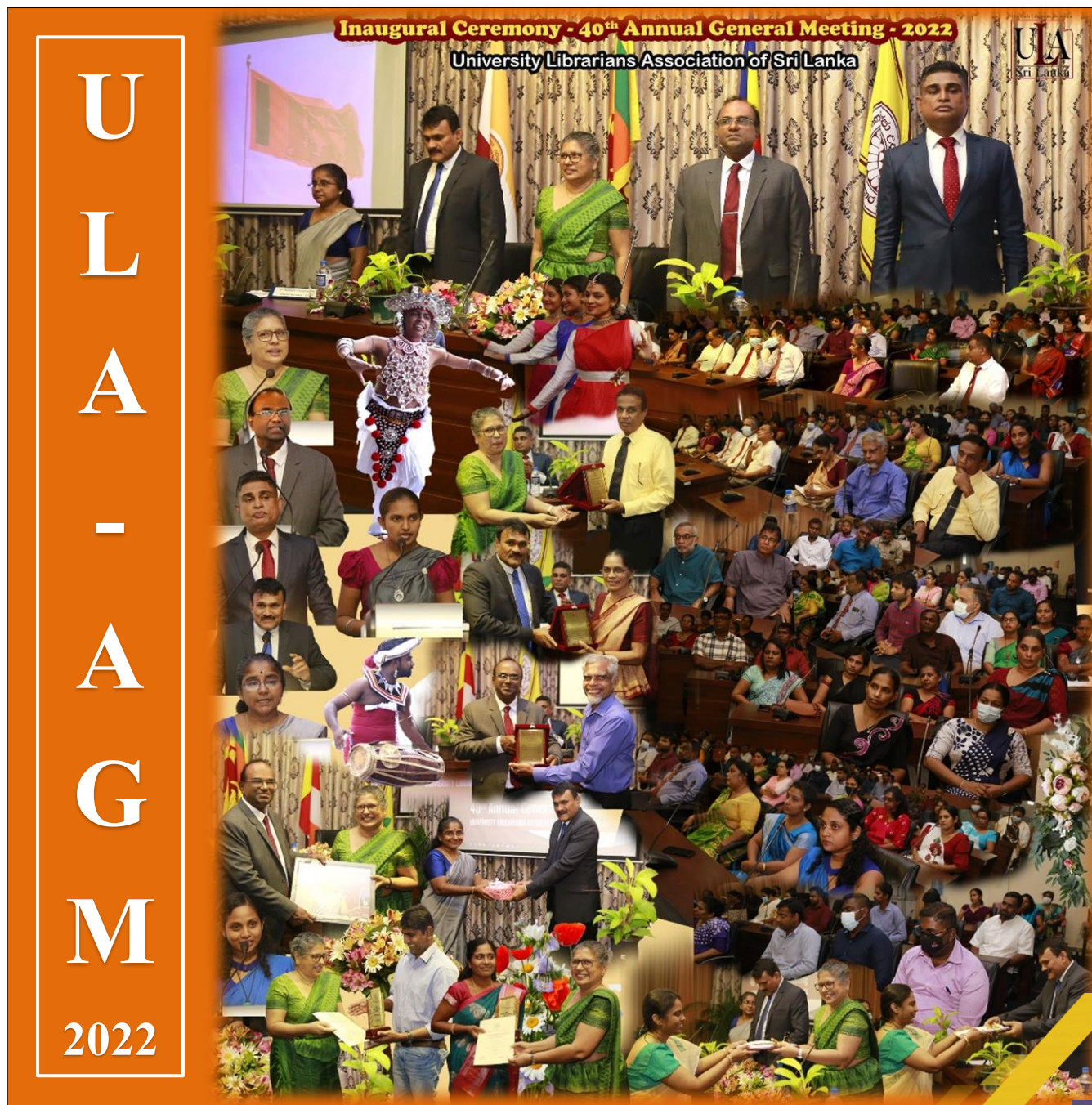

ICULA 2022 International Research Conference

The 12th International Research Conference (ICULA 2022) on “**Connecting People through Transformative Libraries**” organized by the University Librarians Association of Sri Lanka (ULA) in collaboration with the Standing Committee on Libraries and Information Sciences (SCOLIS) of the University Grants Commission (UGC), was held at the Planetarium Ball Room, Mirage Hotel, Colombo on Thursday, the 27th of October, 2022. As the conference commenced, the Chief Guest, Senior Professor Premakumara De Silva, the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Libraries and Information Sciences of the University Grants Commission, Sri Lanka, and the Guest of Honour, Professor V. Kanagasingam, the Vice Chancellor, Eastern University, Sri Lanka were greeted and accompanied by Dr. W. J. Jeyaraj, the President (2021/22) of the University Librarians Association of Sri Lanka & the Conference Co-Chair and Dr. C. C. Jayasundara, the Conference Co-Chair along with the Kandyan Dance Troop.

A total of 120 local and International participants attended the conference. The opening event was a traditional fusion dance performed by the undergraduates of the Swami Vipulanandha Institute of Aesthetics Studies (SVIAS) of the Eastern University, Sri Lanka and then followed by a video documentary that elucidated the history, achievements, and milestones of ULA over the years.

Dr. W. J. Jeyaraj, the President of ULA, delivered the President’s Address stating that librarianship has been evolving to keep up with the rate of change in information and communication technologies (ICTs). However, use of these technologies was radically affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. Now that the pandemic is over, technological devices and the way we access data using them are now a lot more powerful. The Co-Chair Dr. C. C. Jayasundara delivered the introductory speech of the Conference, stressing the purpose and timely nature of the Conference theme, “Connecting People through Transformative Libraries”.



In his address, Prof. V. Kanagasigam spelled out that the growth of Librarianship as a profession has been increasingly recognized and respected in the present information arena and reminded of the multi-dimensional functionalities added to the responsibilities shared by librarians. In recognition of Prof. V. Kanagasigam's presence and valuable address, he was presented with a Trophy of appreciation by Dr. C. C. Jayasundara, the Conference Co-Chair.

Next, the Conference Proceedings, the Official Journal of ULA 'JULA' and the Newsletters were ceremoniously handed over to the delegates of the head table by the Publication Secretaries of ICULA 2022, Dr. Chiranthi Wijesundera and Dr. K. D. N. Harshani.

Gracing the lectern next, was the Chief Guest Senior Prof. Premakumara De Silva. In addressing the audience, he specified the concepts related to the urgency of transforming libraries. He also stressed "how readership can be aligned with modern user expectations by properly harnessing technology". Dr. W. J. Jeyaraj, the President of ULA presented Senior Prof. Premakumara De Silva with a Trophy of appreciation.

Dr. Manoja Samaradiwakara, Co-Secretary ICULA 2022 conveyed a note of appreciation through a formal vote of thanks ending the inaugural session of the research conference that was compered and anchored by Dasuni Athauda, Television News Presenter.

The core of the conference began with three technical sessions that discussed vital research papers on 'Information Needs, Seeking, and Applications', 'Performance Indicators and Evaluation', and 'Physical and Human Resource Challenges in Libraries' chaired by the University Library Professionals Dr. Wathmanel Seneviretne, Dr. Namali Suraweera, and Dr. D. Chandrani Kuruppu respectively.

A stimulating discussion panel invited all participants to a brainstorming session on "Challenges and Opportunities in Transforming Libraries in the New-normal situation. This session was moderated by the Vice President of ULA, Mrs. Ruvini Kodikara. The panelists of this session were Dr. C. C. Jayasundara, and Dr. Namali Suraweera.

Rewarding the presence and participation of the attendees, the valedictory session featured the summarization of the conference content and concluded with the awarding of certificates for the Best Paper and Best Presenter. Dr. Udaya Cabral and Mrs. M. P. Rajapakshe received the Best Paper and Best Presentation awards, respectively.

The conference was wrapped up luxuriously as every individual delegate who attended this event reaped the optimal research outcomes discussed and dispersed through research paper presentations.



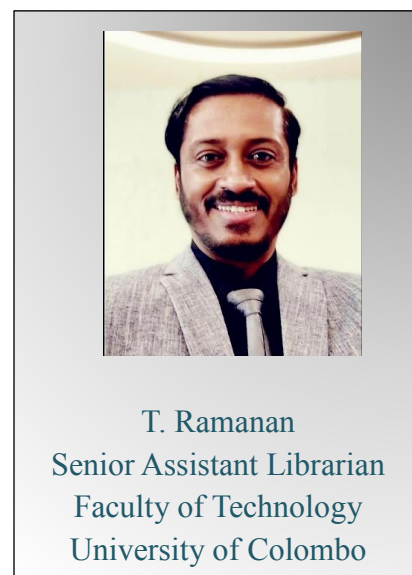

Faculty-Library Collaborations: Making Academic Library Services pertinent to Learning Management Systems (LMS)

Online Delivery of Education and its Challenges

Needless to mention that Sri Lanka is already in the process of online education using open and distance learning modes. It has happened to be a hybrid, combining traditional classroom teaching-learning system and the digital technology. Despite the popularity of Learning Management Systems, Khashunika et al., (2021) record that Sri Lankan learners found it difficult in embracing the online learning options and that research students mostly disliked the digital environment that hindered them from meeting with their supervisors. These gaps could be bridged and challenges could be addressed, with the help of academic librarians, them being the liaison makers between learners and resources.



Most of the instances, these challenges are interwoven with transitioning of the stakeholders due to the digital transformation in higher education. Generally, students of Sri Lankan universities complete their school education in a conventional setup and many of them do not have the privilege of enjoying much of ICT facilities and devices before stepping into tertiary education. Global Internet usage statistics reveal that the major use of the Internet and social media constituted searching for information, for news items, social networking, entertainment, marketing, digital business, online shopping and education (Angelov, 2020), which shows that education was not the primary purpose of using the Internet. Regarding our teachers and students it is no exception; hence struggles were myriad in number during the COVID-19 when engaging in online education.

Digital Revolution and Libraries

Libraries in Sri Lanka have seamlessly been engaged in permanent or makeshift transformations in the past; nevertheless, we need to question whether they are sufficiently capacitated to face off abrupt changes like terror attacks in 2019, COVID-19 pandemic, and recent economic instability that arrested the entire nation. Being an essential service, perhaps little underrated for its vitality in development, educational sector could not be compromised for any of those unexpected blows. Therefore, educational entities employed various approaches including virtual meeting platforms such as Zoom, MS Team, Google Meet, and social networking sites such as WhatsApp, YouTube and Facebook to deliver the teaching material. Use of LMS has been increasing as it is needed for these teaching-learning activities to be completely online. In support of this Sri Lankan libraries, especially the university ones, have established their digital collections on local publications, past examination papers, and AV material. These libraries host their own LMS, too.

Libraries' Role in Strengthening Online Teaching and Learning

Having considered the above facts, libraries, regardless of their type and scope, have tremendous potentiality in supporting the online education, or simply, teaching and learning activities. Based on the findings of Sriyalatha & Kumarasinghe (2021), the impact of the Internet access when it comes to learning online cannot be omitted. Study further found that many students were affected by the lack of ICT infrastructure facilities, which can be compensated by library's learning commons and computer units.

Inadequate e-learning facilities have been identified in a survey (Khashunika et al., 2021), which again prompts the need of the library's intervention. In this juncture, the libraries play crucial role by providing relevant resources through digital collection, facilitating the students in locating the information, and by giving necessary trainings to orient the learners in LMS and other digital learning environments. Similarly, many university libraries work with their faculties in gathering the past examination papers and have created course modules on LMS to display the question papers of preceding years.

What needs to be done?

Faculty-Library collaboration as a symbiotic relationship is the primary need of the time since online delivery of courses requires additional attention to resource management on LMSs. Unfortunately, much of faculty-library collaboration is not even initiated in some state universities. If they had established liaisons with the faculty, every faculty member might have considered the library as a vital organ equipped with

experienced Librarians. Existing literature too failed to address the importance of libraries in online teaching-learning activities. Therefore, every new enrolment must be attached to the library at least for the first few months to acclimatize them with the tertiary academic environment applying student-centred learning (SCL).

Study by Sriyalatha & Kumarasinghe (2021) proposes conducting both traditional and online courses. Universities gradually switching to online mode may attract more students to engage in digital environment. This has been an opportunity for both institutes and students as they can save money and time. As Morris et al., (2020) suggest the state universities in Sri Lanka may start to deliver non-credit modules and certificate-level courses to tame the students. This would increase the income generated by those institutions, which will be a boon in times of financial crisis, for both parties. However, libraries' role and its importance need special and serious emphasis on it as the libraries possess necessary information resources and enthusiasm to serve. Library resources on LMS are added and developed with the help of faculties and in return the libraries serve the students not only with resources but also with assistance in gaining the knowledge of using digital

information for their learning and research activities. Most importantly, the practice of blended-learning requires the faculty libraries to associate with teaching-learning activities of the faculty that is mostly performed on the LMS. Therefore, faculties need to devolve research support tasks to libraries and libraries on the other hand, need to infiltrate the faculty activities by strengthening the academic responsibilities. This mutual symbiosis will benefit the stakeholders as a whole nationwide.

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Breadth and Depth of Library Automation in Sri Lanka and its Future

Information is used more heavily and frequently by people nowadays than the past decade, thanks to the Internet for quick expansion, the advent of electronic documents, and the advancement of information communication technologies. As a result, human existence is changing, embraced with a necessity for sophisticated instruments to complete their daily tasks quickly and effectively. In line with this shifting global trend, libraries are compelled to offer library services and information to the users promptly and effectively. It follows that it is not unusual that businesses dealing with information-intensive activities, like libraries, have pushed to automate their systems.

Even though automation of libraries began in the 1960s across the globe, it wasn't in Sri Lanka until the 1980s. The library automation process was commenced in Sri Lanka with the installation of computers in libraries. In 1967 the first computer was installed in the country. In 1981 there were 65 computers installed in different institutions across the country and 17 of them were included libraries. However, historical data indicates that until the end of 1982, no library in Sri Lanka used computers (Yapa, 1998). Through overcoming several obstacles, National Science Foundation (NSF) was able to obtain a computer in 1983 to run the operations of the Sri Lanka

Scientific and Technical Information Centre (SLSTIC), which set the stage for the implementation of library automation in Sri Lankan libraries. At the same time UNESCO introduced the library automation software called CDS/ISIS in 1982 which contributed to the advancement of the computerization activities in Sri Lankan libraries by 1987 (Yapa, 1995). University libraries were the entities where automation operations were highly experimented in the county. Initiation of library automation in university libraries began in 1986 following a meeting of chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC), vice chancellors, and librarians of the universities (Inter University Committee on Librarians, 1987). Subsequently, each of the eight university libraries Peradeniya, Colombo, Moratuwa, Sri Jayawardenapura, Kelaniya, Jaffna, Ruhuna, and Open University was able to receive a computer from UGC in 1991. At that time, different proprietary software, namely Alice for Windows, LibSys, and LibSuite, were chosen by these university libraries for their automation process. In parallel, the University of Ruhuna developed their library system using an

open-source software known as Koha (Wijayaratne, 2005). Subsequently, other university libraries commenced automation using LibSys, software that was made available to university libraries by the UGC. Over the time, university libraries began substituting proprietary software with open-source software due to their inability to continue with the annual maintenance costs on proprietary software as well as various limitations imposed by the software owners. Now almost all the university libraries are automated with Koha-based Integrated Library Management System (ILMS).

Even though the automation process has been underway for more than 20 years, to what extent are university libraries in Sri Lanka automated? Do they have a fully automated system? Can they provide their customers with fully automated services? The most of university libraries across the country provide automated circulation services and OPAC facilities to the patrons. However, not all libraries are using every module that the ILMS offers. For instance, the serial management module and the acquisition module. Several libraries continue to operate using traditional practices for tasks like weeding, annual stock taking, and inventory management. Moreover, the automated process should not be restricted to the installation and development of an integrated library management system. It goes beyond that, to ensuring the safety of the library items, coding and labeling materials for easy identification, and much more. Most university libraries in Sri Lanka today have barcoded their books and tagged them with tattle tape, an electromagnetic strip. However, there have been several new technologies emerged, including RFID technologies that allows simultaneous issuance of multiple books, self-checkout stations, book drop facilities, automated sorting stations, inventory control, user-centered services, and many more.

It is great news that the Science Library of the University of Colombo has very recently adopted RFID technology to provide advanced automation services to users. When compared to the beginning of library automation, the time taken for this development and adoption was excessively long. What therefore is the cause for the delay in the progress towards library automation in the country? Due to lack of experts devoted to the automation chores in libraries, library professionals involved in the automation activities had to overwork. Their efforts were not recognized and they were unable to advance their academic credentials since the automation process had taken up so much of their professional time. Severe budget cuts of libraries on investments in automation are another undisputed fact. Whatever the case may be, it is time to be proactive and adopt new technologies such as Virtual and Augmented Reality to offer effective library services, incorporating Artificial Intelligence to provide ready-made user-centered services, integrating face recognition

technologies to identify the patrons and, delivering user-specific services and information to satisfy the fourth generation of users. Therefore, Sri Lanka has a great potentiality to travel further with library automation amidst its economic and other social challenges.

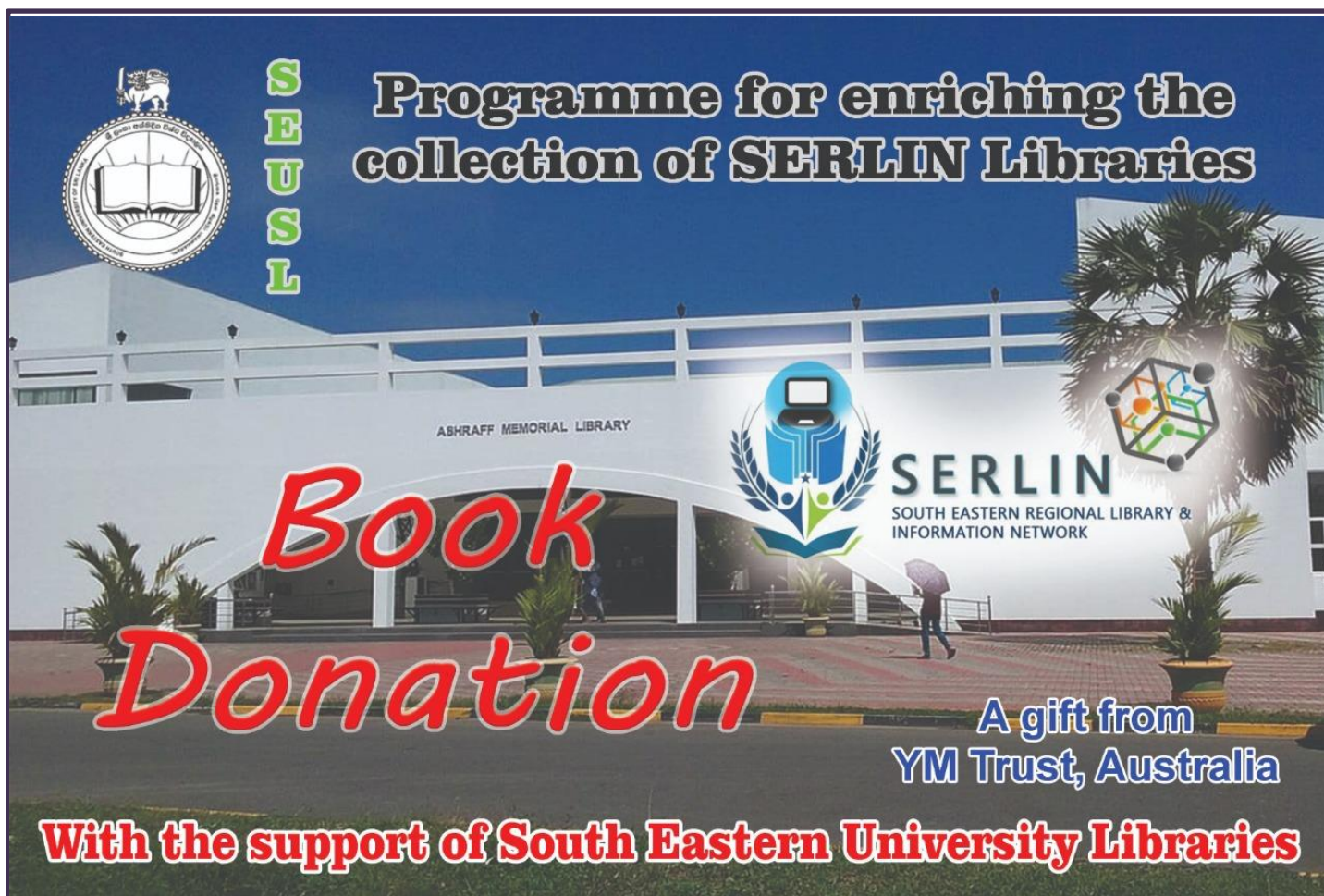
Workshop for school librarians

Research Cube

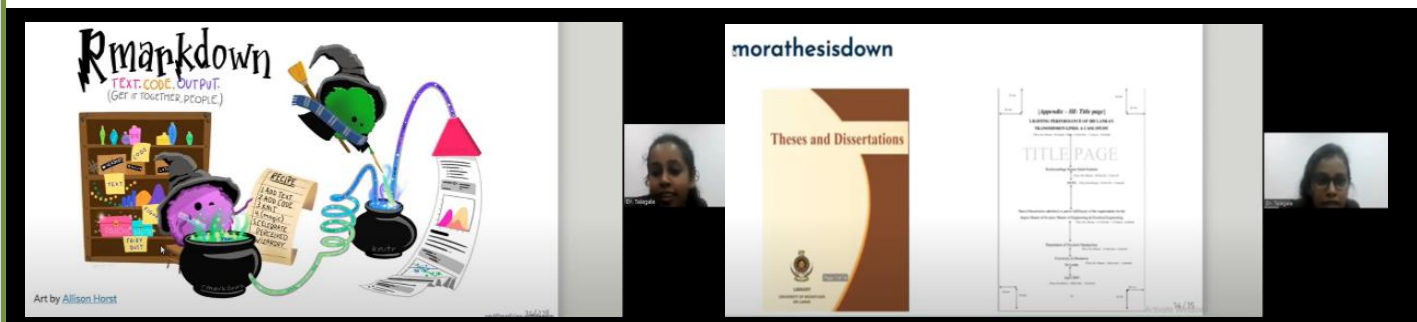

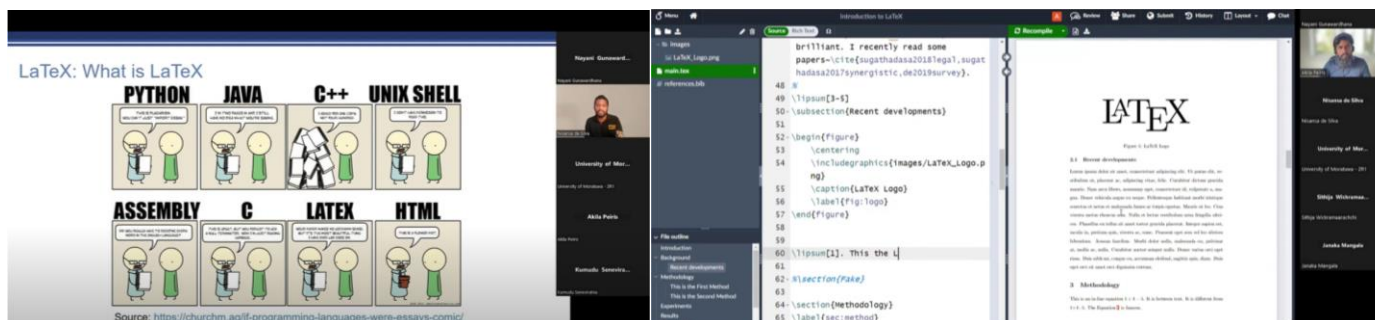
Research Lounge

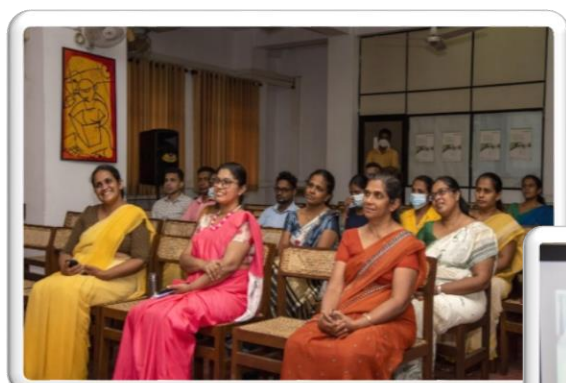
Staff Development Programme on Research Support Activities

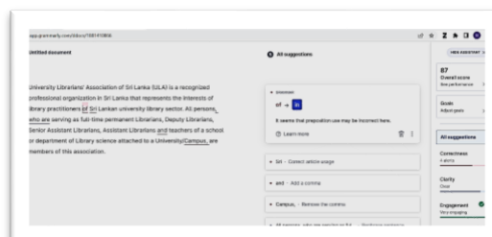
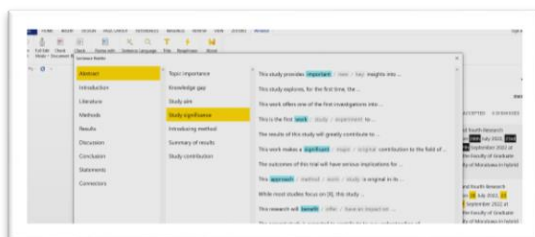

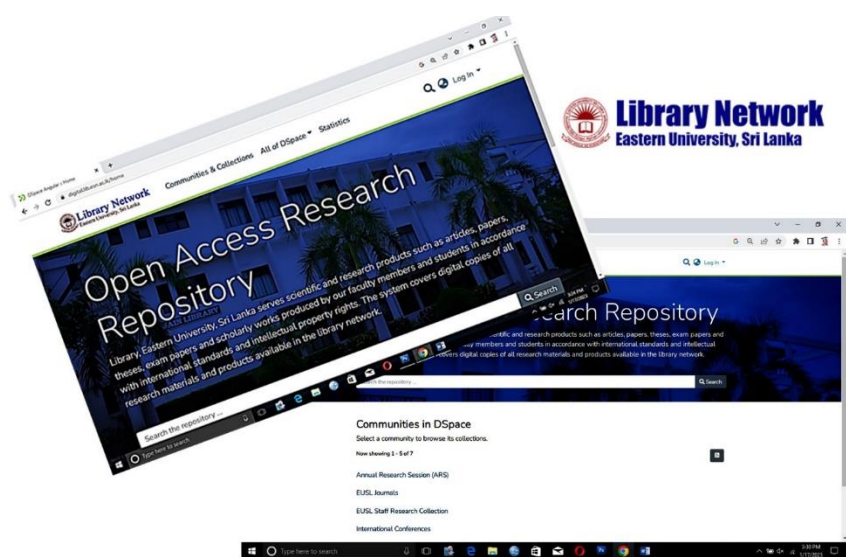
QUALITY ASSURANCE STEPS CARRIED OUT AT THE UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES

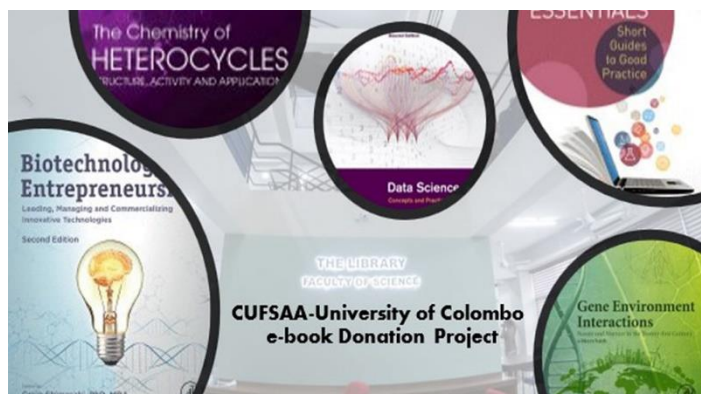
Eastern University, Sri Lanka enters into an advanced version of DSpace

E-Book donation to the Science Library, University of Colombo





Counselling Session and Motivational Program

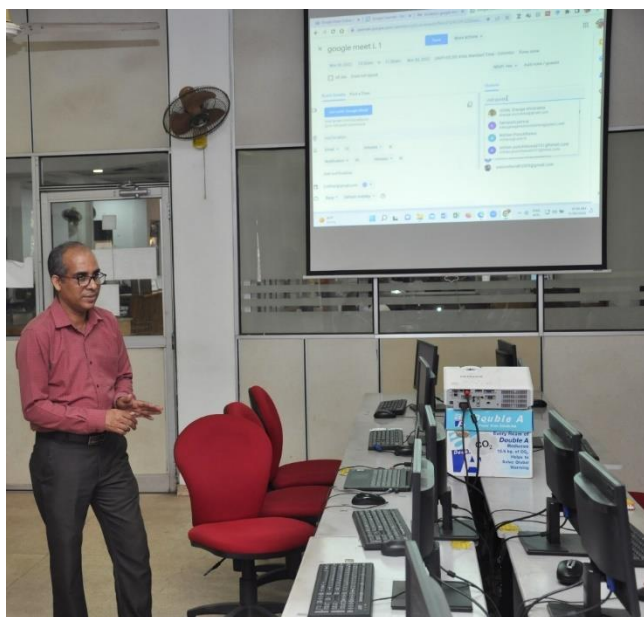

Because of these workshops, the library staff had the opportunity to become more familiar with the applications and also to locate the solutions to the challenges they encountered when working with the applications.

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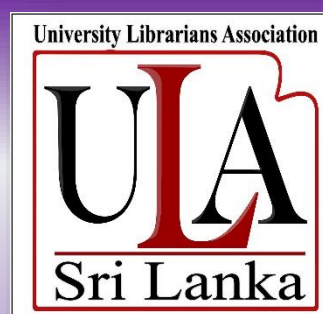
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
