Academic libraries in achieving sustainable development goals:

What can we do?

Introduction

Sustainable development means the overall change and improvement in society as related to the individual in the society and the progress in the social, political, religious, and economic structure of the nation. It is the development that guarantees a better quality of life for everyone, now and for generations to come.

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were adopted by the United Nations in 2015, including more than 150 world leaders, as a universal call to action. There are 17 goals and 169 aims, further, 224 targets which aim to end poverty, hunger, and inequality, on climate change and the environment, improve access to health and education, and build strong institutions and partnerships ensuring that by 2030, all people enjoy peace and prosperity.

Achieving these 17 SDGs and the 169 targets will mean that "No one was left behind", but it will also reflect the progressive and cumulative engagement of countries, communities, sectors, public and private organizations, and citizens in this process.

Many countries in the world, including Sri Lanka have committed to prioritize progress and have taken many steps to facilitate its implementation in the country since 2015 to achieve objectives of the SDGs, by 2030. The Sri Lankan government initiated the following;

- Establishment of a dedicated Ministry, Ministry of Sustainable Development, Wildlife and Regional Development (MSDWRD);
- Establishment of a Parliamentary Select Committee for Sustainable Development to provide political leadership
 and enactment of the Sustainable Development Act No. 19 of 2017 to provide the legal framework for
 implementing the SDGs. (Sri Lanka, 2018)

The SDGs have been welcomed by libraries across all sectors and library associations internationally as a way for libraries to articulate, focus and assess their contribution to their communities. If SDGs in Sri Lanka are to be achieved, citizens need to be well informed, which is possible through dissemination of information taking into account the development indicators raised in the SDGs, hosting local forums where people can discuss problems such as community health, education, environmental issues, climate change etc.

Importance of information in the development of any nation cannot be left behind because it is a vital factor for sustainable development. A nation needs to SDGs for its to meet their ever-increasing demands. To accomplish this, the academic library could play an important role to create, organize, process, store, disseminate and provide access to relevant information. This information would reduce the level of ignorance and help people gain a meaningful living.

Hence, there is a need to find out the role of academic libraries in achieving the SDGs in Sri Lanka. The main objective of the article is to discuss the role of academic libraries in achieving SDGs by 2030.

Role of SDGs in Libraries and university Ranking Systems

Libraries provide infrastructure for information and communication technologies and help people to develop their capacity for using information effectively and preserve information to ensure access for future generations.

Access to information is a cross-cutting issue that supports all of the SDGs. Some ways that libraries can contribute to improving outcomes across the SDGs include raising awareness on the various development issues spelled out in the SDGs and selecting resources considering, the development indicators raised in the SDGs.

A special university ranking system called "Impact Ranking" was introduced in 2019 and the purpose of this ranking is to assess the performance of universities against the UN's SDGs (Mashroofa, 2022). The impact rankings are

inherently dynamic: they are growing rapidly each year as many more universities seek to demonstrate their commitment to achieving the SDGs. To be included in "Impact Ranking," universities must submit data for a minimum of four SDGs, including SDG 17. Goal no. 4 which is of paramount importance, and this refers to the submission of data. In addition, universities can submit data based on SDG 3, SDG5 or any other related goals SDGs (Mashroofa, 2022). In future, more universities are expected to take part, by submitting data related to SDG activities. A university library is described as the 'heart' of the university, which supports all academic activities of the institution through provision of information therefore SGD initiatives would influence the library in its role to enhancing impact ranking of the institution.

Role of the university libraries

The SDGs provide a way to assess an academic library's impact, to contribute to the sustainability agenda, to advocate with influence, and to demonstrate the academic library's role in empowering the lives of students and researchers for the good of the local and global community.

The sustainable development of collections and library services should become essential components of academic library operations. Therefore, academic libraries should provide support for developing information literacy skills and lifelong learning for the public by educating and enlightening youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship. More so, they must go out of the box as limited community is reaching academic libraries, to organize and disseminate information that society will access and use to inform themselves on various life issues and there by empowering communities through knowledge and the ability to access information for themselves. However, the Sustainable Development Solutions Network has identified six areas in which major societal 'transformation' is needed to quickly achieve the SDGs (SDR-2022). They include "i. Education and social protection (SDG 1&4), ii. Health system (SDG 3), iii. Zero-carbon energy...(SDG 13,15) iv. Sustainable food (SDG 2) v. Sustainable urban infrastructure (SDG 11), vi. Universal digital services (SDG 9) and to support all other investments including online education" (Sachs et. al., 2022). Hence Sri Lankan academic libraries can take many steps to promote six areas in which major societal 'transformation' is needed quickly, within available capacity, by;

Developing and promoting sustainable library collection, adding relevant, quality information while helping users, disseminating information and knowledge to a broad category of users and providing equal access to all users.
 Within the current concept of "no building at all", moving to accessing collections electronically has begun to alleviate this problem.

- Playing a pedagogical role which is closely related to information services because when a person is informed, he is equally educated. Academic libraries can introduce information services to raise awareness of SDGs which is a very important role of the library and provide information services by exploring and understanding how our day-to-day work and projects contribute to and make meaningful contributions towards the priorities identified in the SDGs. For example:
- Playing an educational role by enabling a Modern Curriculum (Goal 4: Quality education), teaching courses on environmental information literacy skills needed to promote the ideals of a sustainable future.
- Playing a research role which is an enquiry to discover existing knowledge for the building of theory and solving society problems, an essential activity of the librarians. Further, by advocating with influence, and to demonstrate the academic library's role in empowering the lives of students and researchers for the good of the local community.
- Introducing cultural services as the library is the centre of all cultural activation because it actively promotes participation and appreciation of arts and literature works which is a part of cultural heritage and is one of the areas stock materials highlights.
- Providing access to knowledge since the information is the power and information brings knowledge. Providing
 training and learning media as the library is an indispensable training and learning laboratory. Providing alternative
 access to costly commercial scientific sources, respecting Indigenous Knowledge (Goal 10: Reduced inequalities)
 that is of concern regarding access to information and knowledge.
- Mapping existing activities from usual tasks to annual strategic and operational goals.
- Building internal capacity and ownership of the SDGs by engaging staff at different levels across the library to identify their individual contribution to the goals.
- Monitoring and communicating on actions related to the SDGs through formal and informal reporting to various audiences within and beyond the university community.
- Taking opportunities to engage with staff and stakeholders in conversation about issues of diversity and inclusion,
 poverty, quality education and environmental sustainability. Finally, at the same time, library workers' participation
 and engagement in the ongoing advocacy process must be boosted by providing them with facilities to gain
 adequate sustainability evaluation competencies.

Status of SDG implementation in university libraries in Sri Lanka

Various initiatives have been taken by the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) for the implementation of the SDGs by enacting the Sustainable Development Act No. 19 of 2017. This provides the legal framework and by establishing the Sustainable Development Council as the national focal point it coordinates, facilitate, monitor and report on the SDG

implementation aiming to support the GoSL to achieve peaceful, just, inclusive and equitable development. With the guidance of the University Grants Commission of Sri Lanka, many universities planned to implement activities by incorporating the goals into their Strategic Management Plans, mainly focusing on goal 4 - quality education while trying to achieve the other 16 goals by conducting research. However, it was found that only 08 out of 17 state universities incorporated this in their strategic plans (Mashroofa, 2022). The University of Kelaniya and the University of Sri Jayewardenepura have each established their own "Centre for Sustainability Solutions" (CSS) to formulate policies and to plan, coordinate and manage sustainable issues within the university (Mashroofa, 2022). In addition, the Buddhist and Pali University library also took several actions to implement these goals and to support achieving the university goals (Gunasekera & Samarakoon, 2020). This trend constitutes convincing evidence of the universities' determination to improve the activities related to SDGs.

Conclusion

Academic libraries, 'as the heart of the university 'has major role to play in achieving SDGs by introducing different awareness programmes, services, ODL programmes and conducting research for assisting the GoSL to achieve the SDGs in 2030.

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Integration of Open Science with Sustainable Development Goals

Introduction

Open Science and Sustainable Development are two different concepts that dominate the process of "transformation of the world" in an anticipating structure by present and future generations. It is highly essential to conceptualize these two notions and to find ways how these concepts are integrated with each other. This feature article presents an account on the description of these two concepts and the essentiality of the integration

What is Open Science?

During the last two decades openness in scholarly publishing practices has been much anticipated by researchers, across the globe. Selecting a



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publishing outlet by means of the green or gold route of open access models is considered in this regard. However, apart from scholarly publishing, there are many other activities that need to be performed openly in a research cycle or process. This is simply defined as "open science (OS), which is an umbrella term that encompasses research practices that promote transparency in scientific research", Parsons et al., (2022). They described OS processes as "research practices that include but are not limited to study registration, use of preprints, open access publishing and open data". Open Science embraces all these processes, that are practiced under the philosophy of 'transparency in scientific research'.

The term open science is very clearly defined by UNESCO as


"Open science is a set of principles and practices that aim to make scientific research from all fields accessible to everyone for the benefit of scientists and society as a whole. Open science is about making sure not only that scientific knowledge is accessible but also that the production of that knowledge itself is inclusive, equitable and sustainable" (UNESCO, 2021)

Furthermore, this definition clearly says that OS is not only access to scientific knowledge but also the process of production which means the research process. This process includes how particular research is proposed, the methodology, data collection tools, data, analysis methods and techniques, and lastly, the final product as a report, thesis/ book, or journal paper. Data sharing and knowledge sharing are highly emphasized via the OS principle. The

logic behind this is the increased availability of data, tools, and processes, scientific practices are reproducible, transparent, inclusive, and collaborative.

OS principal forecasts to increase scientific collaborations and sharing of information for the benefit of science and society; makes multilingual scientific knowledge openly available, accessible, and reusable for everyone; and opens the processes of scientific knowledge creation, evaluation, and communication to societal actors beyond the traditional scientific community. Open Science principal functions based on federated, accessible, interoperated, interconnected, service-oriented, and unified access features of the research process. Through the increased availability of data, tools, and processes, scientific practices are reproducible, transparent, inclusive, and collaborative in nature.

Universal Declaration of Human Rights of the United Nations Article 27, section 1 states that "everyone has the right freely to participate in the cultural life of the community, to enjoy the arts and to share in scientific advancement and its benefits". Accordingly, to share scientific advancements and benefits among everyone, OS principle should be adopted all over the world. However, the ethical issues related to copyright, intellectual property, protecting personal and secret information, and human rights issues may restrict access where FAIR use principle is adopted.

Next, part of this paper briefly describes the concept of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Sustainable development

United Nations (UN) formulated and proposed 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), with 169 targets, in 2015. To evaluate the success, they have identified 244+ indicators. SDGs have received immense attention of the whole world, as it is a universal agenda to transform the world. This agenda targets a 15-year active participation (2016-2030) of all countries to envision a better-developed world in 2030. Almost 08 years have passed in this venture and 07 more years we can work to transform the world in all these 17 aspects. Each stakeholder is affording much to attaining SDGs by strategizing various activities within their scope and discipline. In this series of activities, UNESCO emphasizes that OS should support to achieving SDGs by solving economic, environmental, and complex social challenges.

Social challenges in the sense can synonymized as 'global challenges' at present. This may be in various formats such as poverty, war, climate changes, natural disasters, man-made disasters, health crises like COVID-19 pandemic and epidemic, environmental degradation, and humanitarian crises etc. How to respond to these types of challenges? This creates inequalities in access to science, technology, innovation, and their applications. To mitigate the challenges, reducing or bringing to an end any such challenges may depend on various factors. But mainly this could be reduced or ended by reducing digital, technological and knowledge divide between and within countries.

Science, technology and innovation can better respond to them if they collect and apply ideas from diverse contributors and knowledge systems. Open Science will immensely help in reducing or ending inequalities. The next part of this paper deals with how OS is integrated with SDGs.

Why do we need integration between OS and SDGs

Access to information is a basic requirement for all human beings, beyond the Scientific community. Access to information may not be always with research/scientific process, but rather this may be cultural, indigenous, or local knowledge system. Citizen science has now expanded the concept of information to everyone. In this regard, Open Data, Open-Source software, Open hardware, Data repositories and knowledge repositories serve to the general public as well as the Scientists.

Especially, data sharing is the global trend at present in achieving SDGs. National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) has established centre for Earth Science data at https://www.earthdata.nasa.gov/technology/open-science (Earth Science Data Systems, n.d.). In this venture International Research centre for Sustainable Development Goals, located at Chinese Academy of Science, Beijing China launched a satellite on 05 November 2021 which sends data to the centre regarding the forest cover, crop cover, mangrove area, global temperature, water resource data, carbon emissions, land degradation, etc. The SDG indicators are well progressing under this project. They have created a platform for Big data which is available at https://sdg.casearth.cn (CBAS China, n.d.). Furthermore, the Committee on Big DATA (CODATA) is also has taken this challenge to accelerate activities related to SDGs through sharing of data. Global Open Access Cloud (GOSC) is another project undertaken by the Chinese Academy of Science in collaboration with CODATA. Many other developed and developing countries (like Africa, and Malaysia) are marching forward in attaining SDGs through OS.

Conclusion & Recommendation

Open Science can contribute to many aspects of attaining SDGs in 2030. Sri Lanka also should work to share data by establishing data repositories and inputting our data to the international portals by developing a central policy and becoming a member of the world forum of OS and OS societies.

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
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Achievements and Awards


Academic Contribution

Awareness programme for the Academic Community of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka




