13th International Conference of University Librarians Association (ICULA 2023)

The 13th International Conference of University Librarians Association (ICULA 2023) was held on 26th October 2023 at the Hotel Mt. Lavana in Colombo on theme of “Transforming Academic Libraries for a Sustainable Future”. Eng. (Dr.) Udeni Wickramasinghe, Chairman of the Tertiary and Vocational Education Commission (TVEC) of Sri Lanka graced the inaugural session of the ICULA 2023 as the Chief Guest. The Keynote Speech on the topic of “Digital transformation of academic libraries for a sustainable future” was delivered by Senior Professor K. P. Hewagamage, University of Colombo School of Computing (UCSC). The conference had three (03) technical sessions with carefully selected thirteen (13) papers including full papers and extended abstracts.



The first technical session was on “Supporting sustainability in teaching, learning and research” and Dr. Prasanna Ranaweera, Senior Lecturer of NILIS, University of Colombo chaired the session. The second technical session was on “AI, digital transformation and sustainability in libraries” was chaired by Dr. (Mrs.) M. M. Mashroofa, Senior Assistant Librarian, South Eastern University of Sri Lanka. The third technical session was on “Sustainable academic publishing practices” and Dr. W.J. Jeyeraj, Librarian, Eastern University Sri Lanka chaired the session. Over 100 participants representing various sectors such as academic libraries, research libraries, national libraries, as well as LIS education attended the conference.

Ms. A. P. U. De Silva and Ms. B. G. S. P. Wimalasiri from the University of Kelaniya won the 'Best Paper Award' while Mr. B. E. S. Bandara from the University of Peradeniya won the 'Best Paper Presenter Award' of ICULA 2023.

The Multidisciplinary Desk Research Conference (DRC) – University of Kelaniya

The first-ever Multidisciplinary Desk Research Conference in Asia organized by the Library of the University of Kelaniya was held on the 6th of December 2023 at the Faculty of Commerce and Management Studies, University of Kelaniya. The conference aimed to raise the profiles of research studies derived from secondary sources.

The conference covered a spectrum of disciplines, including Arts and Humanities, Commerce and Management Studies, Science, Technology, Medicine, and Social Sciences. Each discipline featured a leading paper delivered by an eminent subject expert, complemented by over 75 scholarly research papers presented by esteemed academic staff members and postgraduate students.



Noteworthy keynote speakers include Emeritus Professor Ariyaratna Kaluarachchi, former Vice Chancellor of Visual and Performing Arts; Senior Professor D. W. R. K. Somadeva from the Postgraduate Institute of Archaeology, University of Kelaniya; Professor Senaka Rajapakse, Director of the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo; and Professor Anuradhani Kasthuriratne from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya.

The conference was graced by the esteemed presence of the Vice Chancellor of the University of Kelaniya, Senior Professor Nilanthi De Silva, serving as the Chief Guest. The Librarian, Dr. C.C. Jayasundara, the Staff of the Library, the Deans of the Faculties, Heads of the Departments, and Academic Staff representing all the Faculties of the University of Kelaniya graced the conference as guests of honour.

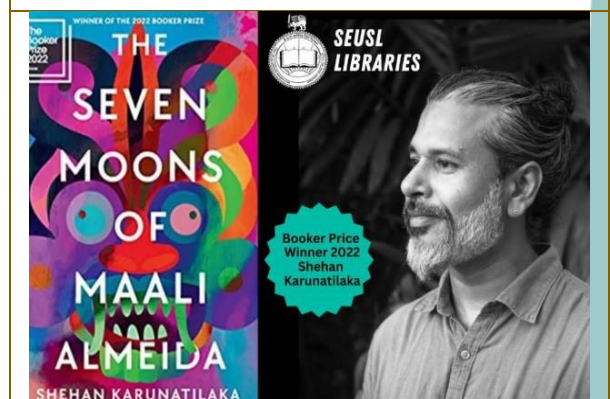

- II. The Second book talk was conducted on the 25th of October, 2023, about the book Titled as "Exploring Sri Lankan Muslims : Selected writings of MMM. Mahroof," edited by Prof. MLA. Cader, the founder Vice Chancellor of the South Eastern University of Sri Lanka.
- III. Third event was introduction of the works of Svami Vipulanandar who is recognized as the world's first Tamil Professor. His writings and contributions were highlighted during the third event.
- IV. The fourth book talk featured the introduction of the major Islamic Tamil Epic, "Seerappuranam," on "Umar is an allegory in Seerappuranam".

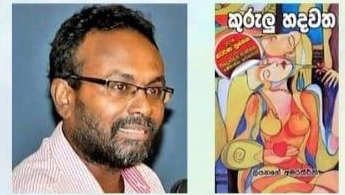




Plazz Café Project of SUSL library

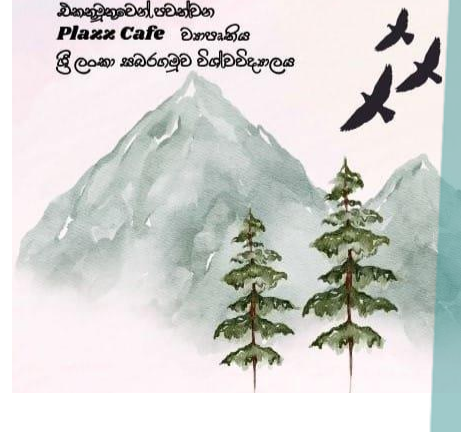

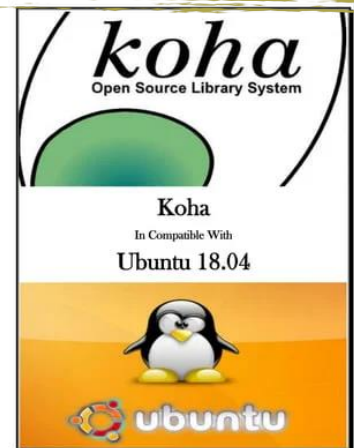

Training on Linux Operating System University of Colombo

In a move to enhance the technological proficiency of its library staff, a training session on the Linux Operating System was conducted on 04th December 2023. The session was led by Mr. N. Hettiarachchi, the Librarian of University of Ruhuna, and was aimed at equipping senior staff and selected Library IT Team members with essential skills for handling the Library Management System (LMS) using the Linux OS. During the training, participants were introduced to common Linux commands, providing them with a solid foundation to efficiently carry out tasks and operations within the Linux environment.



Training programme for newly recruited Assistant Librarians (Trainee) to the Open University Library

A month-long training programme was conducted for .03 newly recruited Assistant Librarians (Trainee) in the Main Library of the Open University of Sri Lanka. The training commenced on 03rd October 2023 and was carried out until 30th October 2023. The objectives of the programme were to provide basic awareness of the teaching and learning system of the OUSL, to provide an understanding of library services and functions including regional library services, to train them to adapt to the culture and operational setup of the library and to improve skills on library management and other professional work including metadata creation and classification.

Training programme for Open University Library Staff

The Main Library, together with the Staff Development Centre (SDC) of the OUSL conducted a one-day motivation program for the library staff members on 31st October 2023. The staff of the Open University Main Library and Kandy Regional Center Library participated in this program. The main theme of the program was "DISCOVER THE POWER WITHIN YOU" and the programme aimed to teach how to overcome self-limiting beliefs to bring a new way of looking at yourself and your job role. The training enables library staff to learn new concepts on self-development, and the session comprised of few activities to enhance their skills in different aspects. A model mapping the role of the clinical medical librarian in healthcare team participation.

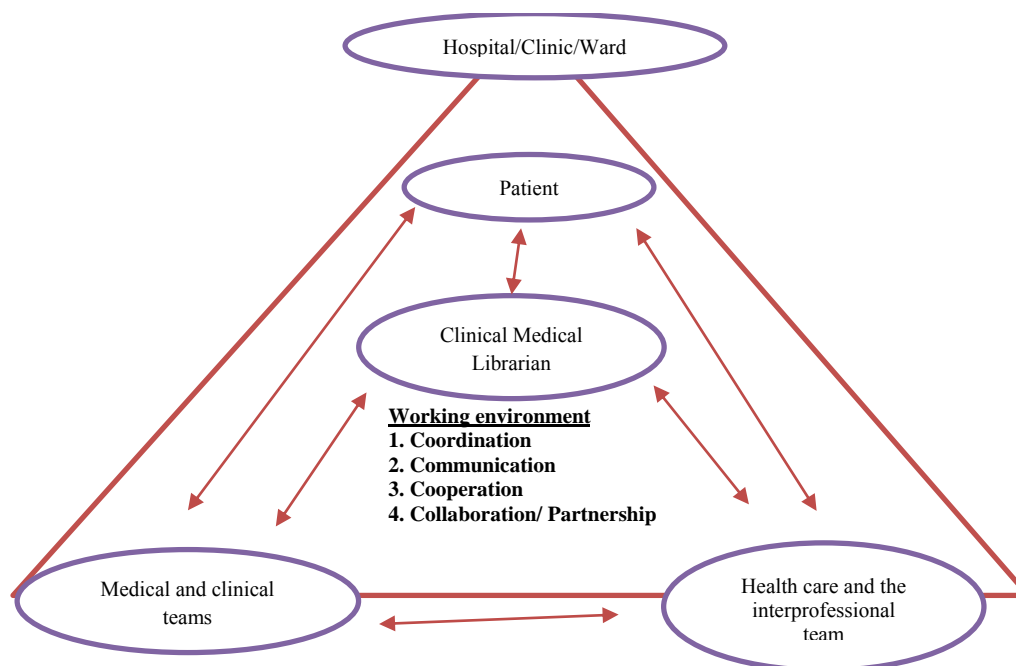


Figure 1: Model mapping the role of the medical librarian in healthcare team participation. (Compiled by author)

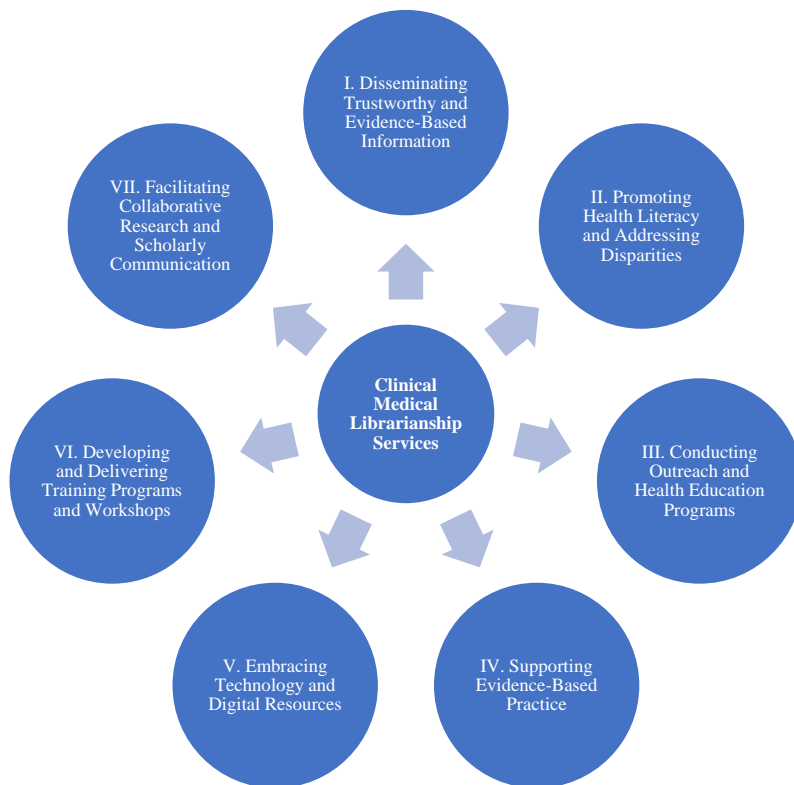


Figure 2: Medical librarianship Services. (Compiled by the Author)

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Navigating the Economic Crisis: How Libraries Employ Open Source to Empower Patrons

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Introduction

Libraries must adapt and innovate to continue meeting the research needs of their patrons in the face of economic crises and constrained budgetary resources. Fortunately, the emergence of open-source resources offers libraries a golden opportunity to flourish despite financial constraints. Open-source resources encompass a wide range of materials, including academic journals, databases, educational materials, software, and data repositories. These resources are frequently made freely available and open for anyone to use, alter, and distribute. Libraries can provide invaluable support to researchers, students, and the community at large in a significant way by utilizing open-access publications, learning resources, software, and data repositories. By harnessing open-source solutions, libraries can continue to serve as hubs of knowledge, education, and innovation, offering invaluable support to researchers, students, and lifelong learners.

During an economic crisis, the impact of open-source resources on libraries in fulfilling patrons' needs becomes even more pronounced and essential. Despite constrained funding, open-source materials allow libraries to keep offering helpful services and assistance to their communities. There are two significant effects of open-source resources on libraries during an economic recession.

1. Sustaining Access to Information

Since open-source resources are free, they represent an attractive alternative for libraries with limited resources due to budget constraints. Libraries can sustain their services without spending additional expenses by utilizing open-access journals, textbooks, and software. Open-source resources guarantee that libraries can continue to have access to vital information, scholarly content, and educational materials even if they are unable to afford pricey subscriptions. This encourages patrons to pursue ongoing education and research opportunities even in difficult circumstances. Libraries can continue to serve as important knowledge hubs in their communities despite economic difficulties. Libraries confirm their dedication to giving customers critical services and resources by embracing open-source materials.

2. Empowering Research and Innovation

The availability of open-source software and data repositories allows libraries to support research and innovation for the users despite their financial constraints. Researchers can leverage these resources to advance their studies and contribute to knowledge creation. By utilizing open-source resources, libraries inherently support the principle of equitable access to information. This can encourage advocacy for open access to research, contributing to a more equitable and inclusive scholarly ecosystem

Different types of open-source resources have been introduced to the patrons for their research and other educational activities at the library.

Open-Access Journals and Databases:

Open-access journals and databases serve as invaluable repositories of scholarly research. Libraries can grant access to their patrons for a vast collection of peer-reviewed articles across various disciplines without subscription fees with platforms like the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), PubMed Central, and Sri Lanka Journals Online (SJOL). Today, many world-famous scientific publishers such as Elsevier, Taylor & Francis, Emerald, Springer, John Wiley & Sons, etc. have offered considerable space in their commercial scholarly databases for open-access e-books and e-journals. As per the Scimago Journal & Country Rank list published in 2022, Ca-A Cancer Journal for Clinicians is the top Q1 journal which is published by Wiley-Blackwell as an open-access journal (Scimago Lab, 2023; Sources, 2023).

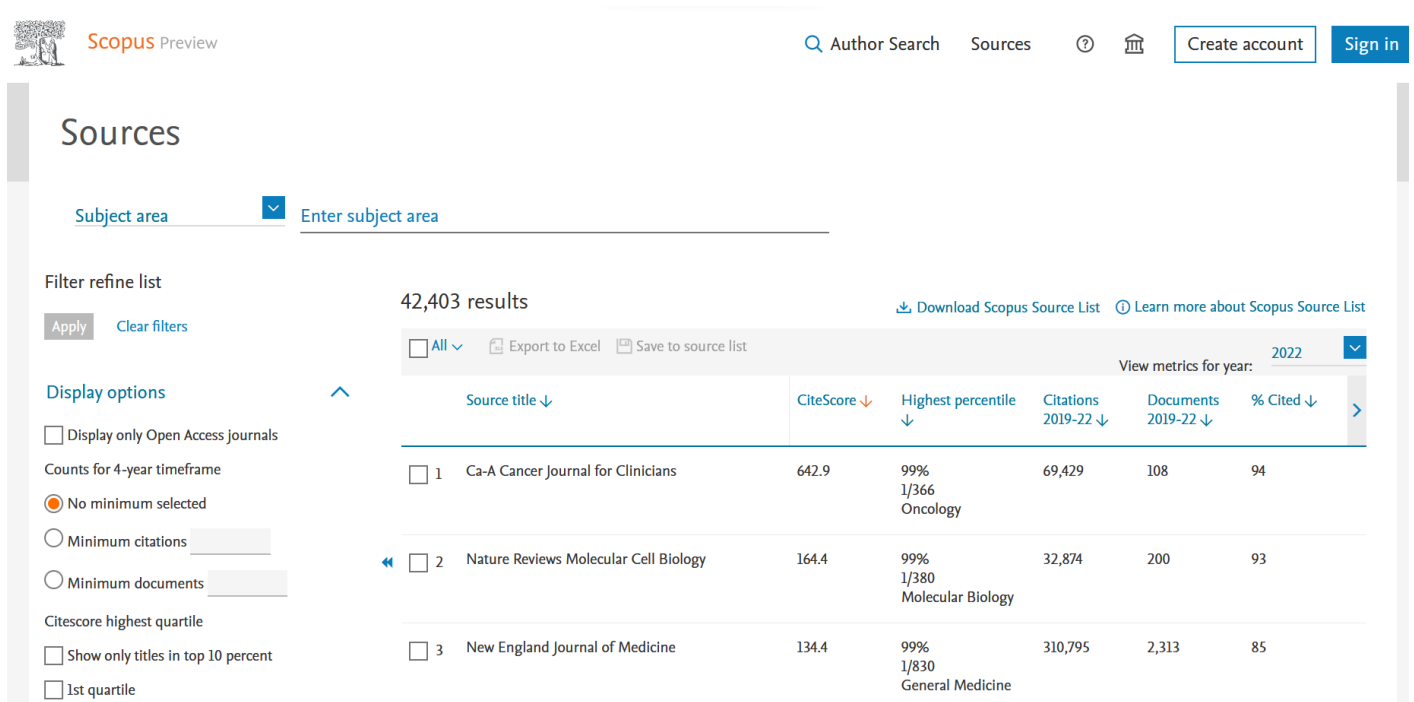

**Open-Source Software:**

Libraries can replace costly proprietary software with open-source alternatives to provide patrons with essential tools. There are many open source softwares that could be used for various kind of library operations.

Documentation: Libraries looking to upgrade their aging computers running Windows or making large purchases of computers that need a new operating system can benefit greatly from operating systems like Linux and Ubuntu. An open-source alternative to Microsoft's Windows operating system is called Linux. Ubuntu is a Linux variant. The main purpose of the computers provided in many libraries is to allow patrons to access the Internet. Ubuntu provides a perfect solution to offer the access to the Internet for users.

Also, software like LibreOffice, GIMP, Firefox, Thunderbird and PDF Creator offers users the freedom to create, edit, and design without the burden of licensing fees. With a user interface and feature set identical to other office suites, LibreOffice comes with the essential desktop apps, including a word processor, spreadsheet, presentation manager, and drawing software. GIMP is an open-source graphic application that has been modified to mimic the interface and feel of Adobe Photoshop. The web browser Firefox was created as a response to Microsoft's Internet Explorer and has become the most popular alternative to IE in recent years. The Mozilla Foundation's open-source Thunderbird is a substitute for Microsoft Outlook Express. It is a desktop email solution that is safe and secure and functions precisely like Outlook. The Open Office files could be converted into official PDF documents using the open-source PDF creator (Randhawa, 2008).

Further, libraries could initiate introducing free tools like Zotero and Mendeley for their researchers to use research and reference management tasks.

Developing Integrated Library Systems: Currently, libraries all around the world are using Koha, Evergreen and NewGenLib softwares that are most popular fully functional open-source integrated library systems. For many smaller libraries that lack the funds to buy, set up, and operate an ILS, Koha is an ideal substitute. Today, many Sri Lankan Libraries have equipped with KOHA open-source Integrated Library Management Systems for conducting the library transactions (Ramanan, 2010) .

Developing Digital Libraries: The DSpace, Greenstone and EPrints are open-source digital library software used for the construction and presentation of information collections. Among these programs, Dspace is a ground-breaking digital institutional repository that digitally records, maintains, indexes, and disseminates the intellectual products of academic research. As (Ramanan, 2010) has indicated, DSpace open-source software is the most popular software for developing digital libraries, digital archives, and institutional repositories among the Sri Lankan Libraries.

Web Publishing: WordPress is a perfect open-source alternative to build a web site from scratch. The most important aspect of this software is that it's simplified interface and content management system. Drupal is an another open-source web publishing solution that makes it simple for an individual or a group of users to publish, manage, and arrange a wide range of material on a website (Randhawa, 2008).

Access to Open Data Sources: By tapping into open data sources such as Data.gov and Zenodo, libraries can equip researchers and data analysts with an extensive array of datasets to fuel groundbreaking studies without incurring additional costs. Also, libraries can employ open-source analytics tools such as OpenRefine for data analysis.

Challenges in Embracing Open-source Resources

Digital Divide: An issue presented by the digital divide is that not all customers may have equal access to the Internet or other necessary technology. Libraries must find creative solutions, such as providing computer access and facilitating Internet connectivity for underserved communities (Selwyn, 2006).

Quality and Credibility: Ensuring the reliability of open-source content is crucial. Libraries play a vital role in educating patrons about discerning trustworthy sources and evaluating the credibility of the information they encounter (Pandey & Tiwari, 2011).

Limited Technical Expertise: Adopting open-source technologies can be hindered by limited technical expertise within library staff. Investing in professional development and training can empower librarians to navigate these resources effectively.

Sustainability: The longevity of some open-source projects may be uncertain, especially if they face funding challenges. Collaborating with other libraries and organizations to pool resources can enhance the sustainability of open-source initiatives.

Conclusion

As libraries face economic crises with no budget allocation, embracing open-source resources emerges as a viable strategy to maintain their critical role as knowledge hubs. By leveraging open-access journals, OER, open-source software, and data repositories, libraries can continue to serve their patrons without financial strain. While challenges exist, proactively addressing the digital divide, investing in information literacy programs, and supporting staff development can enable libraries to thrive in the face of adversity.

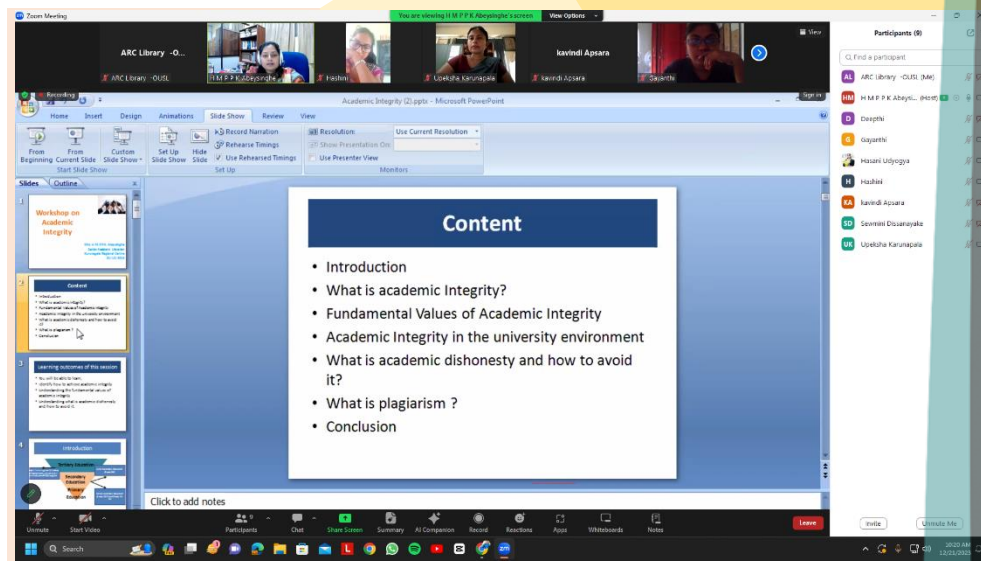


The following areas were covered by the workshop.
