JULA Awarded One Star





According to Journal Publishing Practices and Standards (JPPS) assessment report, Journal of the University Librarians Association of Sri Lanka was awarded "One Star". This assessment was done in January, 2018.

JPPS framework provides detailed assessment criteria for the quality of publishing practices of Southern journals. In 2016, JPPS framework was introduced to the journals in Sri Lanka Journals Online (SLJOL). All journals in SLJOL were assessed by International Network for the Availability of Scientific Publications (INASP) against the JPPS criteria ranking them into six levels: inactive title; new title; no stars; one star; two stars; and three stars. JULA looks

forward to achieving two-star status ...





JULA was first published in March, 1995 by the ULA Executive Committee 1994/1995 under the guidance of Mr. R. Rubasingham, Librarian, University of Moratuwa as the President, ULA. Mr. K.J. Sirisena was the first Editor of JULA.

Importance of a Reading Librarian




Y hy do we choose a profession under a roof filled with books? There may be so many reasons. You may receive a good salary, receive social dignity, your ambition of working as a librarian or it may be your destiny. Even if we like or not the future path has been designed to walk towards accompanying information sources to satisfy the desires of reading community. However, at present, we are lamenting that readers do not visit libraries because modern technologies

stage, a simple question arose in my mind. Do we as library professionals read to motivate others?

When browsing the literature, I met a librarian who set good examples to the profession. Being the University Librarian of University of California, Los Angeles in 1944, Lawrence Clark Powell placed his lovely thoughts on pleasure of reading in several books: Books in my baggage; Adventures in reading and collecting; A passion for

progress; selected writings were very few of them. In a review on Books in my baggage, mentioned Powell's thoughts; "Books," he says "determine, have determined, and will determine our lives, as readers and writers, for this, let us give thanks" (Pargellis, 1960). In another review of the mentioned book, the reviewer showcased the exemplary life style of a librarian who considered books as his soul.

As bookman or traveler, critic or raconteur, he insists again and again that the librarian should be as literate as the reader, and that somehow the emotional impact of the book on the librarian will be communicated to the reader (Cameron, 1960).

According to my own experiences at working in libraries, I feel what Powell's thoughts were true because the love towards books will open the eyes of a library professional in a different way when he or she communicate with the reader. If we are enriched with knowledge, literature, arts and current affairs according to Ranganathan's principles,

every reader will be able to have a book in his or her hands. By reading, our vocabulary, language will be nurtured and not only readers but good writers and speakers will be born from the library professionals.

Speaking about the Sri Lankan context, Mr. H.A.I. Goonetileke who was appointed as the Librarian of University of Peradeniya in 1971 brought out the importance of a library especially to the university system in a brief article. In 1975, he saw the functions of an academic library which are even relevant to present but unfortunately still the system has not absorbed yet.

In his writing he emphasized the qualities of library staff in order to quench the thirst of information seekers. The members of the library staff must constitute a body of active minds prepared and eager to lead the readers not only to the right books, but also to the various and complicated ways of finding where and what the right books are (Goonetileke, 1975).

I was fascinated by reading Mr. H.A.I. Goonetileke's piece of writing and at the same time felt shy about neglecting our own responsibilities and duties which he predicted years ago. He pointed out that the library is the heart of the university which supplies life blood and the intercessional roles of the both institutions serve a larger intellectual community of a country where both should succeed by playing the roles. He proudly mentioned about his library

tickets as "survive as mute witnesses to those halcyon days when the seeds of a personal vocation being sown" (Goonetileke, 1975, p. 133). No words can express his generosity towards the harvest he reaped by becoming a frequent visitor in a library. I feel that his love towards reading has made him an eminent scholar in Sri Lanka.

To become a fully enriched person, I feel reading is a must. Accepting Francis

Bacon's famous saying "reading maketh a full man" we all know that our

imagination will grow, we will learn new subjects, and working capacity will reach

new horizons. The limited knowledge of a person will never make him a genius

though he wants to pretend. Milestones of giant library professionals all over the

world have taught us lessons to be learned. It is time to get up from the rolling chairs

to walk through the world of discovery to smell the pages of books to discover

hidden treasures and open them to the heads of future generation. My intention is

to read, read and to read to become a dwarf under the footsteps of a giant where to

by heart the nation, without reading we are half dead. The sentimental personal qualities will be infected to the reading library professionals to listen the heart beats

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of readers.

Digital Resources Development and Staff Training Division at UoP


Practical Sessions to Enhance Research Skills of Fashion Design and Product Development Students at UoM

User Education Programme on ''Effective Use of the OUSL Library Webpage'' at the Matara Regional Centre (MRC) Library




Career Guidance Workshop conducted by Jaffna Regional Centre (JRC) of OUSL at Mannar Al-Azhar National School


