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## EVENTS IN FOCUS

### International Conference of University Librarians Association – ICULA- 2018

The 9th International Conference of the University Librarians Association of Sri Lanka was held on 20th of September 2018 at the Golden Rose Hotel, Boralesgamuwa. The theme of the conference was “Academic Libraries as Research Saturation Centers: Reshaping the Libraries for Tomorrow”. It was an excellent opportunity to present research outcomes and discuss the latest developments in the field of Library & Information Sciences. Foreign and local scholars in the field participated in the conference. Dr. (Mrs). Nayana Wijayasundara the Conference Chair, Dr. Champa Nilmini Kumari Alahakoon, the Convener and the committee members worked hard for the success of the ICULA2018.

The Inaugural session was graced by the presence of Dr. Harsha De Silva, Honorable State Minister of National Policies & Economic Affairs and Honorable Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs, as the Chief Guest and Prof. Hemanthi Ranasinghe, the Dean Faculty of Graduate Studies, University of Sri Jayewardenepura, as the Guest of Honor. Dr Kiran Kaur, Associate Professor of the Department of Library and Information Science, Faculty of Computer Science Information Technology, University of Malaya, Malaysia, delivered a very informative keynote address on “Supporting Research Activities: The continuing challenges faced by Academic Librarians”. ## GENERALIZING LIBRARY OPERATION AND SERVICE FRAMEWORKS TO CREATE LINKED LIBRARIES

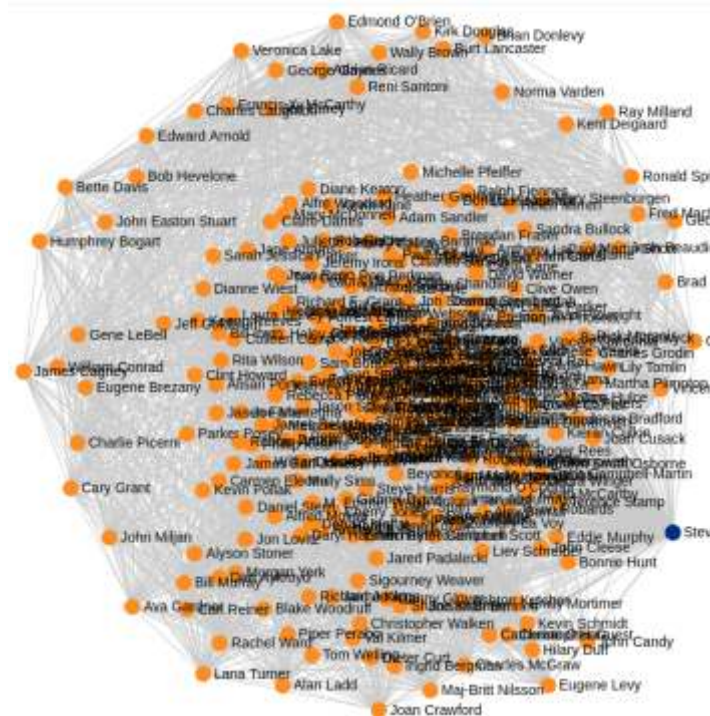

The evolving technological advancements experienced through the past decades have shaped the present. The major trend that we observed was solely linked to the way in which technology contributed towards connecting different entities from all around the world. Currently, through the existence of social media platforms, we exist as nodes in a mass single network. The data we store on our social media platforms are normalized to identify the missing connections that are not explicitly observed. This is a sample visualization of how our social media data is reasoned and analyzed to infer the relationships or friendship between different users. This enlightens us as to how similar or dependent our personal data and activities are to that of someone else!



### Battling vs Preserving Traditionalism

There is one sole purpose defined for libraries and that is the preservation of knowledge and content. The traditional libraries have managed to carry out their purpose successfully to a certain extent without resolving to digital storage. But with the increase in the amount of content being generated on digital platforms, digital storage modes have become inevitable. With most of the modern libraries adapting to digitization and automation, some libraries still linger with conventional paper based maintenance.

The major statute in conventional libraries is the preservation of traditionalism as opposed to digital libraries that battle traditionalism. There is a common misconception that digitized libraries reciprocate in the abandonment of traditionalism: the touch and feel of ink on paper. However, the trick is in finding the pivotal balance between the amount of digitization that needs to be done in order to preserve the materials available as traditional hard copies.



## Automation vs Digitization

Though the terms, 'Automation' and 'Digitization' may seem similar, they differ in the perspective of library environments. Digitization is mainly concerned with providing the paper based books and resources in the form of digital sources such as e-books, journals, researches, and so on. Digitization also paves way for the accommodation of information in the form of various senses. With paper based materials, sight acts as the principle sense that contributes towards the comprehension of the content. Considering digital information, there are ways in which the auditory sense can come into play as well. Sound can trigger an enhanced comprehension of content on top of mere sight based reading. In addition, such alternative forms of resources can be of aid to the differently abled and the vision impaired library users.

Moving on to Automation, it leans more towards digitizing the way in which the library services are provisioned or implemented. In order to serve a number of users efficiently, the manual workforce needs to be supplemented with digital workloads. Hence, the processes of acquisition, circulation and cataloguing will be automated to manage and maintain the meta information about the resources in the library, the library users, their operations and generate high level analysis reports.

Hence, striking the balance between [Automation + Digitization] and conventional resource maintenance will indicate the success of transitioning libraries. Even if most of the libraries have seemed to have achieved the optimum point, the issue that we are now facing is the singularity, or better worded, the isolation of libraries.

## Isolation vs Individuality

Being individualistic is way different from being isolated. Isolation constricts the evolution where no input can flow in or vice versa. But being individualistic implies the existence of unique characteristics. This does not imply the singularity of a being but rather a distinctive adaptation. Hence, being an individual is better than being isolated. But why do we need to talk about isolation vs individuality with regard to libraries?

As it is mentioned previously, though modern day libraries have attained the prime structure of having a well balanced [Digitization + Automation] and traditionalism, their structures are isolated. There is no connectivity between different library frameworks. Now we may find this hard to believe on the basis of mentioning the availability of external journals and databases. True. However these external journals and databases are not within the internal library framework that this article is trying to capture. They can be considered as more of an external service extended by the preference of the libraries.

We have already skimmed through how our digital data can connect all of us into a single network. All the data in such social networks are not always useful to every single person. Instead, we directly access only the exact information that we need, and do not care about the rest of the data. Similarly, what we require is bringing the individuality of different libraries into a single network such that they are all connected but still preserve their own identities within the network.

When the information from different libraries are connected by a network, it will be easier to identify the availability of resources in other universities, developing a vast collection of information. The digitized resources of the libraries need not necessarily be included in the network as some libraries may have purchased private collections. However, even if they are included, their contents do not have to be made public over the network.

Each library can selectively opt for the details that they would like to make public and leave the rest of the details private. Such selective networking will give an opportunity to build the largest knowledge graph of information resources used for academic undertakings.

The mass accumulation of bringing libraries together can be a mere concept at a high level. But the cooperative accumulation of information will prove to be useful in discovering information that was not available previously. Link prediction, Missing link discovery, Collective reasoning and inferring new information will be only a few useful actions that can impact the value and quality of information stored by libraries.
