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

One-stop Login for Library Services

Introduction

The Library of the University of Ruhuna (https://lib.ruh.ac.lk) fully automated its functions and services using an open-source software, Koha in 2003 becoming the pioneering open-source library management system in the country.

Currently, the library system offers a variety of online services including Open Access Catalogue (OPAC), e-resources such as subscription based full-text databases, e-books, institutional repository which contains theses and dissertations, conference proceedings etc. Except for OPAC search, all the other services are authentication-based services where patrons must login to the system providing their credentials (user ID and password) to access them. Moreover, additional features of OPAC such as renewing loans, viewing fines, reserving items, viewing borrowing history, making lists from search results, making purchase suggestions, and adding a reader's review to a title can be identified as some authentication-based services.

Further, the users must provide separate authentications to access each of these different services. As an example, OPAC login cannot be used to access institutional repository or licensed databases.

Current Situation

The lack of unified access credential is a disadvantage as patrons have to remember a number of credentials (usernames and passwords) to access the library online services discouraging users to do so. Realizing this shortcoming, it is essential to remove multiple authentication credentials and establish a single authentication (login) credential to access all online services and thereby enhance user experience. Since single authentication allows patrons to navigate seamlessly between various library online services, it helps patrons to take the full advantage of the online services offered.

Therefore, the library initiated a project to implement a single authentication credentials for library online services and started working on stage-by-stage basis in 2021. This article highlights the features experienced in the first stage of the project in establishing single authentication credential for the OPAC services in the University of Ruhuna. The experiences sharing will be useful for those who use Koha for their library OPACs and facing the same authentication issue.

Process of Implementing Single Authentication Credentials - Single Sign-On (SSO)

SSO is an authentication method that allows users to access multiple applications by signing into a single account. As an example, by signing into Gmail, a user will have access to its various other applications such as Google docs, Google maps etc.

Easy authentication and fewer passwords to remember are the most prominent benefits of SSO, and it also allows centralized control of user access, enforce better password policies, eliminate password fatigue, reduce unsafe password saving strategies, lessens the password phishing, reduce IT helpdesk calls (Smallcombe, 2020; Teravainen, 2021), thus SSO can increase operational efficiency throughout the organization.

If SSO is established in the library environment, users can access all its online resources and services (Eg. E-Journals, E-books, Zoom, WI-FI, all OPAC features) by using a single authentication (i.e., username and a password) without having password and username for login to each one separately. In other words, SSO simplifies and enhances the user experience of library online services.

Koha, the software used to develop ISURu (Information System of University of Ruhuna) offers several external authentication services to the patrons to access the system such as Google's OAuth 2.0 with OpenID, Lightweight Directory Access Protocol (LDAP, Central Authentication System (CAS), Ebsco EDS/Open Athens, Security Assertion Markup Language (SAML) 2.0, and Shibboleth. Since the University of Ruhuna provides an e-mail account via G Suite for students as well as all staff, it was decided to use Google Identity service to establish SSO for the library online services. Using Google OpenID authentication service, library successfully integrated SSO to ISURu in the year 2021 for the first time in Sri Lanka in the University system.

Process of Execution - Google OpenID Connect

Google Identity Service supports OAuth 2.0 and OpenID Connect (OIDC) protocol to verify the identity of a user by federating the authentication. OAuth 2.0 is an open standard for authorization. It provides secure access for an application to a resource on behalf of the resource owner. OAuth 2.0 can be used with web, desktop, and mobile applications (Introduction to OAuth 2.0, 2021).

OpenID Connect is a simple identity layer, which is built on top of the OAuth 2.0 protocol (Introduction to OAuth 2.0, 2021). Google OIDC provides SSO service when a user signs into Gmail. It offers SSO services that make it simple, secure, and reliable for users to log in and for administrators to manage users across the organization. It is possible to create different credentials for different web and Android applications using the Google Identity Service.

Configuration of Google OpenID Connect with Koha

By following the steps shown below, it was configured google OpenID connect with the Koha system. The steps taken to configure Google OpenID with Koha are demonstrated in Figure 1.

Figure 1: Process Map




Figure 2 shows that the client ID and client secret received from Google after adding the path to authorized redirect URIs. Figure 3 displays the screen appears once access to the global system preferences in the Koha system after receiving the client ID and client secrets from Google.

Figure 2: Client ID and Client Secret





Figure 3: The GoogleOAuth2ClientID, GoogleOAuth2ClientSecret and GoogleOpenI Connect



Transformation

The e-mail accounts provided by the University of Ruhuna to its staff and students could be used as the e-mail addresses of the patrons' accounts in the ISURu. This allowed them to maintain a single user ID and password between the two systems of Gmail and ISURu. Thus, SSO for library OPAC services was successfully achieved.

University of Kelaniya was promoted to Senior Lecturer- Grade 1.


Achieving Level 2 of Strategic Relationships, Toastmasters International in Public Speaking


Academic Contribution

The Chapter has set up a YouTube channel to host multilingual videos for disseminating awareness on a variety of topics on COVID-19 in the South Asia region. Through these videos, the Chapter aims at reaching out to the masses in the South Asia region which is highly impacted by COVID-19. The overall objective is to create awareness of many aspects of COVID-19 and to help in creating videos that act as MythBusters. The topics of the videos will provide accurate & reliable information, thereby helping to fight misinformation and disinformation regarding COVID-19. A total of 10 videos on a wide range of topics related to COVID-19 such as 'Myths about COVID-19 vaccines'; 'Stay safe from COVID-19 without or before vaccination';

'Vaccine Facts: All you need to know about them'; 'Myths about COVID-19' and many more are to be added. These multilingual videos are available in English, Sinhala, Hindi, Urdu, and Bangla. Only one major language from each country was selected for translation, where the project members did the translation.

As an extension of this project, the project team collaborated with The University of Hong Kong, Academy 22 Education for All Company Limited (NPO), and ASIS&T - Africa Chapter to organize a creative digital story writing competition for primary secondary school children in the South Asia region. This competition aims to capture the experiences of children during COVID-19. In order to provide the proper training required for the creative digital story writing competition, the project will also organize a series of workshops for school children.

MOU with Homagama Local Government

The library of the Open University of Sri Lanka (OUSL) is engaged in a new project of automating 05 public libraries of the Homagama local government under the



theme of "Our Public Libraries-Homagama". The project's primary purpose is to develop ICT infrastructure and automate all public libraries using Koha Open Source LMS.

This makes a remarkable benchmark to the public library automation history of Sri Lanka as project involves automating all public libraries simultaneously from the same local government. The project is funded by the Homagama local government under the

leadership of the Chairman of the local authority, Mr. Sampath Jayasinghe. The project is managed by the Consultancy and External Resources Centre (CERC) of the Open University. Mr. A. H. K. Balasooriya, System Librarian is leading the project. It is expected to be completed successfully within the first quarter of 2022. The Open University Library has supported to automate more than 70 public libraries using Open-Source Software-Koha through CERC.



Librarian, PGIM, coordinated the event. The Tutorial available at;







Training Program on Google Workspace for Library Office Work




Mrs. D. P. C. Vithana, Librarian- Acting of the Uva Wellassa University contributed as the
