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





Final Tribute to Late Prof. Jayasiri Lankage and Mr. Harrison Perera


University Librarians Association of Sri Lanka (ULA) expressed its sympathy on the demise of two eminent retired Library Academics within a short span of time.

The Open University of Sri Lanka (OUSL) marked a significant milestone with the inauguration of its first batch of Level 3 students in the Bachelor of Arts in Library and Information Science (BA LIS) program. The event, held on March 9th, 2024, at the Audio-Visual Resource Center of the Main Library, was graced by Prof. Anton Piyarathne, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, serving as the Chief Guest.

As Sri Lanka's sole open and distance Mode University, OUSL initially enrolled students for Level 5 of the BA LIS program in 2018, akin to the third year of a conventional university. With three batches having successfully graduated, the introduction of Level 3 provides a second entry point into the program. Prospective students with three passes in their Advanced Level examinations or equivalent qualifications may now enroll in Level 3. Additionally, those possessing a three-year diploma in LIS or similar qualifications can enter directly into Level 5.

In a heartfelt moment during the ceremony, alumni of the BA LIS program paid tribute to Dr. (Mrs.) Wathmanel Seneviratne, the visionary behind the program, for her invaluable contributions to the university and the LIS field. The New Age of Library Services: Librarians as Bibliotherapists


Introduction

Bibliotherapy is a therapeutic tool that uses books to help people overcome mental, physical and emotional issues. It assists in healing persons by using various forms of literature. Bibliotherapy can be categorized and named differently based on the nature of the resources used: book therapy, poetry therapy, web therapy, digital therapy, multimedia therapy, etc. Bibliotherapy is a unique and transformative practice that connects a long history. "The use of books for treatment purposes received special and widespread attention following World Wars I and II. With many soldiers returning from battle with posttraumatic disorders or symptoms, Bibliotherapy was considered a cost-effective treatment" (Bankar & Patil, 2021). Today, bibliotherapy has evolved into a widely accepted and appreciated form of therapy, increasing its importance and popularity worldwide. The library has become an essential resource center in this movement with its extensive and diverse collection. Libraries are not just bookstores; they have converted into dynamic living centers that adapt to the changing needs with librarians' capacity. The evolving role of librarians as bibliotherapists reflects a significant shift in the library profession and they are adapting to their users' changing needs and demands. This transition highlights the librarian's expanding responsibilities and skills, transcending traditional boundaries and embracing new dimensions of new services.

Development of IMIF Model

Researcher's experiences from Bibliotherapy presented the IMIF model and it based on her own experience. 'Books on Prescription Model' and 'Cognitive-behavioural therapy' (CBT)-approach were highly considered to develop the model. This model provides a structured framework for promoting the effective use of bibliotherapy in different environments. This model has four stages: Initial, Mirroring, Insight, and Follow-up and has been validated through a medical professional and a senior counsellor using a student group.

IMIF Model

Firstly, the bibliotherapist identifies the client's needs and then carefully selects appropriate materials. Then, tasks are created to start the mirroring process. Once the motivation tasks are formed, the bibliotherapy session begins, usually beginning with a preliminary discussion focusing on the analysis of issues. After assessing the problem, the client receives a book prescription that includes various resources such as printed materials or online, fiction, non-fiction, poetry, translations, audio books and audio-visual books. If the client has multiple urgent needs, priority is given to them. However, bibliotherapy is not recommended for people at high risk and is instead quickly referred to psychiatrists or doctors. It is best suited for individuals with moderate or low risks. When the situation is assessed, a mirroring process begins, and clients engage in reading, writing, drawing, role-play, and developing various skills. At this stage, bibliotherapists use creative bibliotherapy to create opportunities to increase consciousness, build confidence, develop problem-solving skills and promote self-expression. The third stage includes follow-up and evaluation, where clients can revisit the mirroring or insight phases. Sometimes, this process can be cyclical.

Understanding the bibliotherapist's approach

Bibliotherapy is a therapeutic approach to dealing with various mental health problems "Bibliotherapy is a multifaceted concept that is of great importance for the essence of the library profession in the twenty-first century" (Eftimova et al., 2021). Although it is a well-established and popular therapeutic tool in many countries, its application in Sri Lanka is relatively rare. Despite librarians' interest in incorporating Bibliotherapy into library services, lack of appropriate guidelines has been a major obstacle to its implementation. IMIF model can be considered for practising Bibliotherapy in libraries.

Bankar and Patil (2021) have created a prototype model for Academic Libraries, and they pointed out the responsibilities of a Librarian as a Bibliotherapist. These are as follows.

- **"1.** The librarian will make himself familiar with new literature available, and prepare the recommended list of books to purchase.
- **2.** The Librarian must have personal interest and information about books which he plans to suggest to the client/ patron.
- **3.** He must interview each client to find the impression and satisfaction resulting from each assigned or chosen reading. He is responsible for making a written report of the individual clients/patrons' comments and reactions to their reading for further understanding" (Bankar & Patil, 2021).

In order to implement bibliotherapy, librarians need to be familiar with the literature available on various matters. They should possess strong knowledge to analyze and identify the problem. They should have a good understanding of the books that can be used to address different emotional and behavioural issues. The personal interest of librarians is a significant factor in conducting bibliotherapy in libraries.

Bibliotherapy helps improve the mental health of library staff and their users, increasing insight and cognitive flexibility. Bibliotherapy increases job satisfaction by reducing stress and anxiety. Meanwhile, it promotes coping skills during challenging times. Consequently, this scenario presents a mutually beneficial outcome for both library patrons and staff.

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Role of Blockchain technology in Academic libraries:

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Introduction:

Academic libraries play a crucial role in supporting teaching, learning, and research activities of educational institutions. With the advent of technologies and the development of open access to scholarly information, academic libraries face evolving challenges in managing information resources, ensuring data integrity, and adapting to changing user needs. To promote the user needs and library facilities, academic libraries introduce new technologies.

In that respect, Blockchain technology is an advanced database mechanism that allows transparent information sharing within a network. A blockchain database stores data in blocks that are linked together in a chain. The data is chronologically consistent because we cannot delete or modify the chain without consensus from the network. As a result, we can use blockchain technology to create an unalterable or immutable ledger for tracking orders, payments, accounts, and other transactions. The system has built-in mechanisms that prevent unauthorized transaction entries and create consistency in the shared view of these transactions.

The main features of Blockchain technology:

Decentralization: Decentralization is a fundamental feature of blockchain technology, distinguishing it from traditional centralized systems. In a decentralized network, there is no central authority or single point of control. Instead, control and decision-making are distributed among all participants in the network.

Immutability: Immutability means something cannot be changed or altered. The immutability feature of blockchain technology refers to the inability to alter or delete data once it has been recorded on the blockchain. **Consensus:** The consensus mechanism is a crucial feature of blockchain technology that enables multiple parties, often referred to as nodes or validators, to agree on the state of the blockchain and validate transactions without the need for a central authority. Consensus ensures that all participants in the network reach an agreement on the validity and order of transactions.

Cryptographic Hash Functions: Cryptographic hash functions play a fundamental role in blockchain technology, providing the basis for securing data and ensuring the integrity of transactions within a blockchain network. These functions take an input (or message) and produce a fixed-size string of characters, called a hash value or digest.

Blockchain technologies in Academic Libraries:

In the digital age, academic libraries are facing unprecedented challenges in managing vast collections of digital assets, ensuring data security, and facilitating scholarly communication. Amidst these challenges, blockchain technology has emerged as a transformative force, offering innovative solutions to longstanding problems in academic library operations. Today, librarians are suffering from the navigation of misinformation, rumor, and so on. As a result, blockChain Technology represents a new way of thinking, analyzing, and problems solving.

1. Decentralization of Blockchain technology:

- a. Digital Asset Management: Academic libraries are entrusted with the stewardship of vast collections of digital assets, including scholarly articles, research datasets, and digitized books. However, managing these digital assets in a secure, efficient, and transparent manner poses significant challenges. Blockchain technology offers a decentralized and tamper-proof solution for digital asset management. By leveraging blockchain technology, academic libraries can ensure the integrity and authenticity of their digital collections while enhancing access and discoverability for users.
- **b. Data Security and Privacy**: In the modern day, increasing cyber threats and data breaches, ensuring the security and privacy of sensitive information is paramount for academic libraries. Traditional centralized data storage systems are susceptible to hacking and manipulation, posing significant risks to the confidentiality and integrity of library collections. Blockchain technology mitigates these risks by decentralizing data storage.
- **c. Distributed Cataloguing:** In a decentralized blockchain-based library system, cataloguing information is distributed across multiple nodes in the network. Each and every node maintains its copy of the catalogue. This reduces the reliance on a central cataloguing system making the catalogue more robust and less vulnerable to failures or attacks.
- **d. Transparency:** Blockchain's decentralized ensures that transactions, such as book loans, returns, and acquisitions, are transparent and trustworthy. Every transaction is recorded on the blockchain and, with permission, available to all members of the network. Because consumers can independently confirm the correctness and authenticity of transactions, this transparency fosters user trust.
- **e. Collaborative Resource Sharing:** Interlibrary loan and resource sharing are essential components of academic library services, but current practices are hindered by bureaucratic hurdles and inefficient workflows. Blockchain technology provides a decentralized and transparent platform for collaborative resource sharing, streamlining interlibrary loan processes, automating rights management, and facilitating seamless access to shared resources.

2. Cryptographic Hash Functions of Blockchain technology:

- **a. Tamper Detection**: Cryptographic hash functions enable academic libraries to detect unauthorized modifications or alterations to digital assets. By periodically recalculating and verifying the hash values of stored files, libraries can identify discrepancies that may indicate tampering or data corruption. This helps mitigate the risk of data manipulation, forgery, or unauthorized access to scholarly materials.
- **b. Data Duplication:** The libraries often have large databases with duplicated or similar records. Cryptographic hash functions can be used to create unique identifiers (hash values) for each record. This enables the identification and elimination of duplicate entries, optimizing data storage and retrieval processes.

3. Consensus Mechanism of Blockchain technology:

- **a. Decision Making:** Libraries often operate in a distributed environment with multiple nodes or participants. The requirement for a central authority to approve transactions is removed by consensus processes. Instead, all nodes in the library network participate in the decision-making process.
- **b.** Enhancing Security in Inter-library Loans: Inter-library loans involve the exchange of resources between different library networks. Consensus mechanisms secure these transactions by ensuring that all participating libraries agree on the legitimacy of resource requests and approvals. This connects an extra layer of security to inter-library collaborations.

4. Immutability of Blockchain technology:

- **a. Preservation of Scholarly Records**: Academic libraries often house valuable scholarly records, including publications, research data, and institutional repositories. By leveraging blockchain's immutability, libraries can ensure the long-term preservation and integrity of these records. Once data is recorded on the blockchain, it becomes tamper-proof and resistant to unauthorized modifications or deletions.
- **b. Preservation of Cataloguing Data**: Today, libraries are facing the challenge of maintaining accurate and unaltered cataloguing data. By recording cataloguing information on a blockchain, libraries can achieve immutability. This ensures that details such as book titles, authors, publication dates, and other metadata remain unchanged, providing a reliable historical record of the library's collections.
- **c. Securing Transaction Histories**: The libraries engage in various transactions, including book loans, returns, and interlibrary loans, and maintaining an accurate and unalterable transaction history is crucial. Blockchain immutability ensures that transaction histories are securely recorded. This transparency benefits both the library and its patrons, as anyone can verify the lending and return history of a particular book.

Challenges of Application of Blockchain Technology in Libraries:

- **a. Technical Complexity**: Blockchain technology is complex and requires specialized technical expertise for development, deployment, and maintenance. Academic libraries may lack the necessary in-house expertise or resources to implement blockchain solutions effectively.
- **b. Costs and Resource Constraints**: Implementing blockchain technology can be costly, requiring investments in infrastructure, software development, and staff training. Academic libraries may face budget constraints or resource limitations that hinder their ability to allocate funds and resources to blockchain initiatives
- **c. User Adoption and Education**: Blockchain technology is still relatively new and unfamiliar to many library users. Academic libraries may face challenges in educating users about the benefits, functionalities, and implications of blockchain-based systems, as well as overcoming resistance or skepticism from users.

Conclusion:

In conclusion, the role of blockchain technology in academic libraries has immense potential for revolutionizing resource management, data integrity, and scholarly communication. By leveraging blockchain, academic libraries can establish immutable records of scholarly materials, ensure transparent and secure systems for cataloging and metadata management, and facilitate decentralized access to resources.








Sessions for Bachelor of Architecture (Level III) Students


